Special Olympics Wyoming 2011 Summer Games are scheduled for **Thursday, May 19th to Saturday, May 21st, 2011 in Laramie.** Athletes will have the opportunity to compete in up to two sports and multiple events. Registration takes place on Thursday morning with an additional time set just prior to Opening Ceremonies on Thursday evening. Preliminary competition begins Thursday afternoon followed by dinner and Opening Ceremonies. Friday morning will conclude Session I Sports with Session II Aquatics and Athletics starting that afternoon. The Victory Banquet and Dance are scheduled for Friday evening (**Theme:** 70s “flower-child”). Competition will conclude on Saturday by early afternoon.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Medical Forms—Put Team Names on all forms to ensure they are filed properly.

Participants without the proper forms will not be allowed to compete at Summer Games. Athletes with Down Syndrome competing in the butterfly stroke, diving starts, diving events, the pentathlon, high jump, squat lifts, or artistic gymnastics must have an x-ray to determine Atlanto-Axial status. Unified Sports® partners must have an Application for Participation and a Volunteer Information and Registration form on file before training or competition. Please direct any questions concerning various medical forms to either Terry Hart or Travis Barney at Special Olympics Wyoming (307) 235-3062. **ALL MEDICAL FORMS MUST BE UPDATED EVERY THREE YEARS!**

COMPETITION

- Athletes may **not** compete in the same event in Unified Sports® and non - Unified Sports competition.
- Please check the schedule of events for Games. Session I: Basketball (Thursday p.m. and Friday a.m.), Gymnastics (Friday a.m.) and Power Lifting (Thursday p.m.). Session II: Athletics and Aquatics will be held Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. Athletes may compete in two sports, one from Session I and a second from Session II.
- The 2011 Official Special Olympics Summer Sports Rules will be in effect for the 2011 Summer Games. Those rules can be found at the website www.specialolympics.org.
- Athletes should be prepared and dressed for competition. Jeans are not appropriate for any sports competition. Please note uniform numbering rules for Basketball.
- Results for Field Events for Athletics should be recorded and reported in **Meters** (not Feet and Inches).



PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES

Athlete and Unified Sports Partner Forms

Each Local Program is expected to travel with athlete and partner forms. Programs must be able to provide that information at registration. The Application for Participation and the Release are two different forms for athletes and must be on file with Special Olympics Wyoming prior to training or competing.



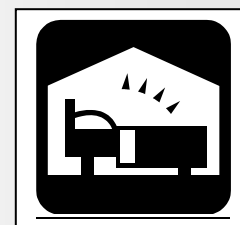
Volunteer Registration and Background Checks

Upon registration and repeated every 3 years any “Class A” volunteer (those providing direct services to athletes such as coaches or chaperone must:

- Submit a completed Volunteer Information and Registration form to Special Olympics Wyoming.
- Successfully complete a background check through Special Olympics Wyoming.
- If age seventeen (17) years or younger, provide two (2) written letters of recommendation, one of which is from a person of authority.
- Complete the Protective Behaviors on-line session at <http://www.sowy.org/protectivebehaviorstraining.shtml>.

Housing Guidelines

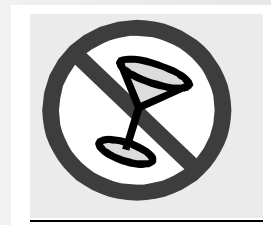
Housing arrangements for athletes and coaches are on a one person per bed basis. Arrangements cannot be made that will ask two people to share a bed. Housing male and female athletes and/or volunteers together is not permitted.



The exception to rule above is a married couple.

Alcohol Guidelines

The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages at a Special Olympics sports event is not permitted. Being under the influence of alcohol is not permitted. In regards to any competitive event this policy is broadly interpreted to be in effect at all sports, housing, meals, and recreation venues associated with the games. Persons violating this guideline will be asked to leave the event and, pending an investigation, may be suspended from participation in Special Olympics Wyoming events.



Smoking Guidelines

Special Olympics Wyoming requires that all competition events be smoke-free. Designated smoking areas will be established away from any athletic competition or other activities associated with Special Olympics Wyoming events.



It is the responsibility of Head Coaches to inform all members of their delegation of the Special Olympics Wyoming policies.

- The Sports Rule Book lists all the compulsory routines. Please check the rules online at www.specialolympics.org. If a copy of the rules is needed, please contact Special Olympics Wyoming Staff. Rhythmic routines were updated in 2008.
- All-around athletes must compete in the same level in all events in order to be entered for all-around. Athletes must be entered separately in each event as well as in the all-around event.
- Athletes may compete at different levels, but not in the same event.
- All athletes must compete in compulsories.
- Athletes in entry-level events may not compete in upper level events.

Artistic -There are five levels of competition

- 1) Level A-Compulsory (mixed gender / male or female)
- 2) Level 1-Compulsory (beginner)
- 3) Level 2-Compulsory (intermediate)
- 4) Level 3-Compulsory (advanced)
- 5) Level 4-Compulsory and Optional

Also, athletes may compete in either Individual Skills Contest or Speed Dribble but **not** both.
- The Individual Skills Contest consists of the Target Pass, 10m Dribble, and the Spot Shot. The athlete's final score is determined by adding all of the scores from each of the 3 events.

- Distances for throwing events should be recorded and reported in Meters, not feet and inches.
- Athletes may compete in a total of four events. The following criteria have been developed for entrants in the following events.
 - Assisted Walk - Athletes may use a walking aid, but may not receive physical assistance from coaches, officials, etc. **Athletes who require a coach to walk along side or help in any way as well as those using assistive devices should be entered as assisted.**
 - Softball Throw - No team may enter more than 20% of their athletes in the softball throw. Athletes may compete in either the Shot Put, Softball Throw, or Ball Throw for Distance (only one of the three). Athletes may not compete in two or more throwing events.
 - Standing Long Jump - No team may enter more than 20% of their athletes in the standing long jump.





2011 Special Olympics Wyoming Summer Games Athletics Venue Information

The 2011 Special Olympics Wyoming State Summer Games Track and Field events will be held at designated locations around Laramie High School's DETI Stadium. We would request that only competing athletes and Unified Sports® partners be present on the field. This will allow the focus to be on the athletes and partners competing in the events.

Athletes will be asked to begin staging about 10 minutes prior to their designated time (please see official schedule for time blocks). With the assistance of volunteers they will then be checked in and escorted to the staging area. Volunteers will accompany the athletes to the starting line and ensure they are in their correct lanes. Additional volunteers will be on-hand at the finish line or end of the event to accompany the athletes to the awards area.

To avoid any confusion we ask that athletes remain with their heats until awards have been received, however the awards area is open to all comers so please be sure to join the athletes in celebrating their amazing accomplishments.

Exceptions will be made to the restricted access policy on the field at DETI Stadium on a case-by-case basis based on information provided by coaches. **Please note** that requests for assistance should be the exception for your athletes and not the rule. Volunteers will be with the athletes at each point from staging check-in to awards ceremonies to facilitate their participation, and make the process as enjoyable and fluid as possible.

- Athletes may compete in a total of four events. Those athletes entered in diving are allowed an additional entry.
- Athletes swimming with an improper stroke will be disqualified. The athlete’s coach will be notified by either the official or venue director.
- The entry-level progression is walk – assisted swim – personal floatation device – unassisted swim. Athletes may be entered in the walk and pfd, but not the walk and unassisted swim nor pfd and unassisted swim.
- Coaches with athletes who have active seizures must be sure to include that information on entry form.

Clarification for Entry Level Aquatics Events

Special Olympics Wyoming offers a variety of events for athletes with lower abilities to assure their full involvement in the program. Entry-level events will be conducted for these athletes to assure their success and to maintain dignity and respect for their efforts.

Descriptions:

Walk: Athlete walks the distance of the race in the water. They are encouraged to take bouncing steps. An athlete that can swim the 15-meter distance should not be entered in the ‘walk’ event.

Assisted: The athlete typically would use a personal floatation device (PFD) of their choice and the coach would accompany the athlete in the water. The coach is allowed to provide physical assistance to keep the athlete going in the proper direction or to provide assurance. The coach may not provide physical assistance to give the athlete forward momentum or to provide a ‘rest’ for athletes.

Personal Floatation Device: The athlete uses a personal floatation device (PFD) of their choice and is expected to swim the distance independently.* Athletes are allowed to use any floatation device of their choice without restriction.

PFD events offered include a 15 meter and a 25 meter race. Athletes using PFD devices **may not compete in relays.

Unassisted: The athlete uses no personal floatation device and swims the distance independently*.

*Independent: The athlete is able to swim the entire distance without using the lane lines or stopping and standing.

Conditions:

*For races any distance of 25 meters or longer the coach must petition to be in the water. Petition by sending a letter prior to games to the Special Olympics Wyoming office, which will then be forwarded to the Venue Director.

*Athletes competing independently in 25-meter events may not compete in 15-meter distances.

*Athletes must be entered in at least two 25-meter distances to compete in relays. **Athletes entered in a 15-meter swim may not compete in the 4 x 25 meter relay.**



UNIFIED SPORTS® EVENTS

- Athletes **may not** compete in the same event in Unified Sports **AND** non-Unified Sports competition.
- Please make every effort to match athletes with partners of similar age and ability. **A coach is not an appropriate Unified Sports partner.**
- Unified Sports partners should be listed on the athlete roster. Please note which individuals are Unified Sports partners.
- Unified Sports partners “Application for Participation” and volunteer registration must be on file with Special Olympics Wyoming prior to training and competition.

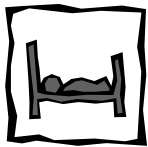

Local programs are responsible for making their own Hotel accommodations. Please note the cut-off dates for most hotels range from April 19th to May 2nd so make your reservations as soon you can.

Reservations can be made individually or by teams and they (the individual or team) will be responsible for payment. All hotels listed accept school vouchers. Also please remember to list the hotel your team will be staying at on your team’s registration form!!
